The process began with the elimination of 755 traditional rules and regulations, replacing them with a Statement of Quality and a set of 8 core principles around which the organization is managed. The Wheaton Police Department looks upon these principles as the foundation upon which they establish policy, strategy, tactics and actions, and through which a partnership of mutual trust is forged with the community. In recognition of his exemplary demonstration of ethical leadership, on March 25, 2010, the Center for Law Enforcement Ethics will present Chief Mark Field with an Ethics Achievement Award.
