Course Overview: Successful completion of this program will authorize graduates to present the eight-hour Law Enforcement Ethics, the sixteen-hour Ethics for Field Training Officers, and four-hour In-Service Ethics courses within their own agencies or local/regional academies.

NOTE: This program blends three days of In-Class instruction with the equivalent of one additional day of interaction and dialogue through the ILEA Online Classroom. At the conclusion of the In-Class portion of the course, participants will have thirty days to complete the Online session. Since the Online material is presented in asynchronous fashion, participants may engage the material at their own pace in their own homes or agencies. Both parts of the program (In-Class and Online) must be completed successfully in order to receive a Certificate of Completion.
